CLARENCE WHITE MARQUETTE- Clarence W. White age 89 of Marquette, died Wednesday, December 22, 2010 at his home in Marquette, MI. He was born on September 24, 1921 in Norway, the son of the late James and Bessie (Osborne) White. Clarence graduated from Norway High School in 1939. He served his country in the U.S. Army during World War II in the Philippines and Japan. Clarence married Sophie Mikolajczyk on August 8, 1942 at St. Barbara's Church in Vulcan. She preceded him in death on February 6, 2000. Clarence worked as a fire and crash truck mechanic at K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base from 1960 to 1984, when he retired. He was a member of St. Peter Cathedral in Marquette, American Legion Post #44, Life Member of Amvets and National Association of Federal Employees (NARFE). Clarence is survived by his son David White of Waukesha, WI; grandson Jonathan White; brother Robert White of Iron Mountain; sister Gladys White of Quinnesec; several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his brother Lewis White and sister Beryl Carlsen. Private Family Services will be held for Clarence. Interment will be held at the Norway Township Cemetery.
