NORWAY- Eugene Joseph DuCharme II age 83 of Norway, died Saturday, September 10, 2022 at Iron Co. Medical Care Facility in Crystal Falls, MI.

He was born May 5, 1939 in Iron Mountain, the son of the late Eugene and Julia (Provo) DuCharme.

Gene lived most of his life in the Dickinson County area and was proud to be a “Yooper”.

Throughout his life he worked for several local businesses, in addition to being the owner operator of the Wildwood Resort in Crystal Falls and the Norway Current in Norway, Michigan. Even in retirement Gene continued working as the owner and operator of Custom Glass Etching in Iron Mountain.

Throughout his life Gene made many lifelong friends, he was especially fond of his camp buddies.

Gene served his country in the US Air Force joining in June of 1957, earning a good conduct medal before being honorably discharged in June of 1963.

On October 17, 1963 Gene married Beulah (Anderson) Price (widow of Gerald Price), accepting the responsibility of helping raise three young boys.

Gene had many hobbies including photography and birdwatching. He enjoyed his time spent with his camp buddies and weekly breakfast crew. He was especially proud of his grandchildren. He loved his dog Frosty who he treated like royalty.

Gene is survived by his wife Beulah "Jackie"; sister Jan (Joe Birch) Kero; three sons Bryan (Peggy) Price, Gary (Nancy) Price, Eugene (Shawn) DuCharme; and special daughter Lea (Todd) Varda; 10 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

Gene was preceded in death by two sons, Scott Price and Michael DuCharme and one grandson Cameron Price.

Family will greet friends on Tuesday, September 20 from 10-11 a.m. at the Ortman Funeral Home in Norway.
