He sold Watkins Products part-time for 30 years. Kermit was a member of the Norway City Band, Iron Mountain City Band and played trumpet in the local band "The Playboys". Member of the Hall-DeWinter Post #145, American Legion and the Norvulet Post #4581, V.F.W. He enjoyed cutting grass and shoveling snow for the elderly people in the community. Kermit is survived by his wife Lorraine; sons Donald (Joanne) Rasmussen of Fort Wayne, IN and Paul (Diane) Rasmussen of Iron Mountain; grandchildren Ronalee, Hannah, Amanda, Micah and granddog Andy; very special Cousin Marie Jacobsen of Escanaba.
