LAWRENCE GAGNON IRON MOUNTAIN- Lawrence "Larry" C. Gagnon age 75 of Breitung Twp. died on Monday, February 27, 2006 at Dickinson Co. Memorial Hospital, Iron Mountain, MI., after a long illness. Larry and Jenny were given a plaque "Outstanding Knight Fans of 1975-1976, they followed the Knights all over the U.P., and with his illness still went to the games now and then.
