MILDRED GIANNETTI VULCAN- Mildred B. Giannetti age 89 of Vulcan, died Friday, September 6, 2013 at Dickinson Co. Memorial Hospital in Iron Mountain, MI. She was born on November 21, 1923 in Vulcan, the daughter of the late Frank and Esther (Koish) Shubert. Mildred married John Giannetti on June 10, 1942 in New York, New York; he preceded her in death on April 13, 1975. Millie's first job in New York was a package wrapper at Macy's and worked as a waitress at Park Central Restaurant on 6th Ave. only a few blocks from Radio City Music Hall. They moved back to the area in the early 1960's to help take care of her father and to be closer to her family. She worked at Kresge's and Montgomery Ward in sales in the appliance department, at the Vulcan Middle School and as the assistant manager at the Iron Mountain Iron Mine in Vulcan. Millie was a member of St. Barbara's Church and St. Ann's Altar Society. She is survived by her grandchildren John Paul Giannetti and Barbara Marie Giannetti (Vance Kelly); great grandson Quinn Giannetti Kelly; daughter-in-law Barbara Giannetti; sister-in-law Beverly Johns; and many nieces, nephews and cousins.
