NORMA ISAACSON WAUCEDAH TWP. - Norma Isaacson age 93 of Waucedah Township died Sunday, January 5, 2014 at Freeman Nursing and Rehabilitation Community in Kingsford, MI. She was born July 20, 1920 in Norway the daughter of the late Carl and Emma (Olson) Swanson. Norma spent most of her childhood on the family farm on the Swede Settlement Road, moving there as a young girl. She attended the Loretto School, then Vulcan High School, graduating in 1939. Norma attended Business College in Green Bay and worked many years for the Niagara Paper Mill as a secretary. She married Mervin Isaacson on August 31, 1958. They lived in Niagara for 30 years and then moved to White Birch Village Community after she retired from the Mill. Mervin preceded her in death in October 1990. Norma loved to travel and made three trips to Sweden. She also visited Switzerland, Germany, and Italy as well as many places throughout the U.S. She grew up in, and was a member of First Baptist Church of Norway. She loved The Lord Jesus and was always concerned with serving Him and loving others. Her home was always open to visitors and she loved visiting others and attending special events. She also took up helping many friends and neighbors over the years that needed love, a safe place, or special care. Her last six years were spent at the home of her niece in Waucedah. There, on the farm, she was surrounded by eight, small, great-great nieces and nephews for whom she showed great love. For a person who never had any children of her own, she finished her life in the love and exuberance of youthful love and joy. She is

greatly missed. She is survived by her sister Eunice Pellegrini of Vulcan; nephew David (Jayne) Swanson of Waucedah; nieces Ardis (Peter) Guerts of San Antonio, TX; Carol (Paul) Hintz of Tucson, AZ; and Christine (Kenneth) McBroom of Waucedah. She is also survived by 8 great nieces and nephews and 15 great-great nieces and nephews. Norma was also preceded in death by her parents and her brother Leonard Swanson.
