VULCAN – It is with heavy hearts that we share the passing of Paul "Stringbean" Opolka, age 69, of Vulcan. Paul passed away peacefully on April 15, 2026, at Pinecrest Medical Care Facility after a courageous battle with MS for over three decades.

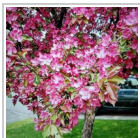
