She had a very generous heart and always had candy available for children. During the Christmas season, she always had a gift for the mail man, bus driver and various others in her community. She was also famous for her Swedish buns, which everyone called "Shirley buns," which she generously gave out to anyone who wanted a bag. Even when she was a resident of Evergreen Assisted Living, she always had candy for other resident members and the staff.
