March 8, 1927 - February 18, 2014

WALLACE C. EVANCE NORWAY- Wallace C. Evance, "DEDE", age 86 of Norway, died unexpectedly Tuesday, February 18, 2014 at his home. He was born in Norway on March 8, 1927, the son of the late Caesar and Inez (Hinds) Evance. Wallace served his country in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He joined the navy in April of 1945. He served in the Seabees (Naval Construction Battalion). He was in Guam, scheduled for the invasion, when the war ended. He also was on Tinian and Saipan Islands. He made a lifetime friend during his service time - Elmer (EJ) Everson; they even got the same tatoos together at the same time. The "best buddies" flew to Washington D.C. this past September 18, courtesy of the Honor Flight. Wallace made a new friend on Honor Flight 5, his guardian for the flight, Jim Tardiff. So this trip was with old friends and new. Wally said it was one of the most memorable experiences of his life. He was a member of the VFW and the American Legion. He married Shirley Stanaway on June 12, 1948 at Grace United Methodist Church in Norway. They then moved to Chicago where he attended Allied Trade School to obtain a Machinist Certificate. They moved back to Norway and Wallace worked for General Controls. He joined the National Guard and attended an army school at Aberdeen, Maryland. He returned home upon completion of his training and enjoyed his road trip home, as Shirley had flown out for his graduation. They shared 65 years of marriage and Wally often told his family what a blessing his wife, Shirley, was in his life. He later attended Northern Michigan University and graduated in 1967

(Cumlaude) with a degree in education at the age of 40. Following graduation, he was employed by Bark River-Harris Schools, Breitung Township Schools (History and machine shop), and then retired (December 1986) from Dickinson Iron Intermediate School District (machine tool and electrical occupations). Wallace lived a full life. Upon retirement, he and his wife wintered in Pine Island, Florida for ten years. They made many friends and had many memorable times there. He purchased a boat and spent much time on the water. He did fish but it was just being on the water that he enjoyed most; he loved water, so this fulfilled one of his dreams. Dede spent the rest of his days keeping busy and was never bored; he commented many times that he "couldn't find enough time in the day"; all his life he had quite a few projects going. He loved working on his computer and wanted to know how the internal components worked as well as using it. He loved technology and was superb at understanding how things worked. He loved learning and felt having a good education was one of the most important things a person could possess. He continued learning until the time of his passing. He loved wild life, nature and animals. He adopted his grandson's two dogs and spoiled them by heating up their bread before he gave it to them. He enjoyed bird watching, fed the birds, and tried to teach his generations of "kids" to learn the names of different birds. One of his great accomplishments was that he tamed two red squirrels (he could hold them and pet them). Growing up, Wallace spent a great deal of time with his dad in the outdoors. His dad was an avid hunter and fisherman. Wallace commented many times that as an adolescent he realized that although he was skilled in hunting, he found he didn't like to kill the animals and so just started enjoying watching them. He had a brilliant mind and could memorize a great deal of material. Even in his late 80s he would quote a chapter of the Bible or Shakespeare. He loved English and vocabulary, was a history buff, and an avid reader. Dede was also handy, he could fix everything. He was a mix of an academic and a mechanic. He built his own home entirely on his own. He had amazing abilities and assumed everyone could do the
